What could go wrong? What hazard have you identified? What are the risks from it?	Who is at risk?	What are you going to do about it? How are the risks already controlled? What extra controls are needed? How will they be communicated to young people and adults and remain inclusive to all needs?	Review & revise What has changed that needs to be thought about and controlled?
<b>A hazard</b> is something that may cause harm or damage. <b>The risk</b> is the harm that may occur from the hazard.	For example: young people, adult volunteers, visitors	<b>Controls</b> are ways of making the activity safer by removing or reducing the risk. For example, you may use a different piece of equipment or you might change the way you do the activity.	Keep <b>checking</b> throughout the activity in case you need to change what you're doing or even <b>stop</b> the activity. This is a great place to add comments which will be used as part of the review.
Heat exhaustion	All of us	Strongly encourage participants to bring a full water bottle. Also encourage participants to bring a hat. Juice breaks. If outside and suffering, offer participants to return inside Kastle.	
Lack of awareness during physical activities	All of us	Participants to stay within their physical limits. Leaders monitoring movement around space and on approach to base.	
Environmental hazards around base	All of us	Leaders will brief participants on approach regarding any specific hazards that present themselves once base has been established.	

Don't forget, as part of your programme planning, you should have contingency activities in reserve just in case you can't do what was planned or you need to stop half way through. Make sure this is shared with those involved, so everyone knows how to respond. You should have risk assessed contingency activities prior to them taking place and communicated key information to those involved as with all activities.
