Welcome to The Blair Atholl Medical Team

Doc Martin and his crew will be working alongside a group of enthusiastic first aiders, paramedics and nurses who make up your Medical Team.

Doc Martin hopes you have a fantastic time and never have the misfortune of needing any medical attention. As you will you be camping at the Jamborette for several nights it is especially important that you try to keep yourself healthy.

Steps you should follow while at camp: If there's sun – wear hats, t-shirts and sunscreen lotion....If it's raining - keep dry. If you're dirty - wash.....If you're not dirty - wash anyway (including your feet).

If you're cooking or eating – wash your hands before you do so.

If you're injured.... See Subcamp staff first (you can apply your own plaster if you want). If you are more seriously injured or unwell.... see Subcamp staff who can arrange for you to see The Medical Crew. If you have an upset stomach or tick bites, tell the Subcamp staff.

If you're accident prone, wear protective clothing at all times if you're not accident prone, take care anyway, especially around guy ropes, fires and sharp objects!!

If wee is clear, no problem here, if wee is yellow, ill fellow.... drink plenty.

Most importantly have fun, enjoy the camp and if you feel unwell see your Subcamp staff first. We have a medical tent located by reception where we run clinics at 9am & 5pm, please see your Subcamp to book an appointment.






The Challenge of the

The White Cockade was the badge worn by the followers of Prince Charles Edward Stuart (Bonnie Prince Charlie) during the Jacobite Rebellion of 1745-6. The Marguis of Tullibardine, son of the 1st Duke of Atholl, carried the Prince's standard when he landed at Moidart and gathered the clans at Glenfinnan. The White Cockade which was worn by the Marquis, can be seen in a display cabinet in Blair Castle. The Marquis' brother, Lord George Murray, was the General in charge of the Jacobite army.

Scouts can win a Cockade badge by successfully completing 12 Activities (all day activities count as 2) and organise and participate in two social activities in the evenings as approved by the Subcamp Leader. In choosing their activities. Scouts must select at least one activity from each of the Activity Zones (Adventure, Basics, Creative, Sport and Treks & Tours). After each activity, the scouts get a sticker to put on the back of their badge to keep track of their progress.




