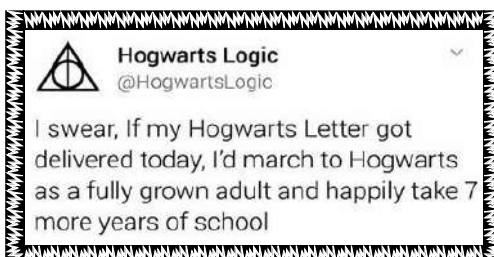


Each Sub Camp had many classic songs sung, and a wee new one. Never thought we'd have to milk our friends, that was a strange one.

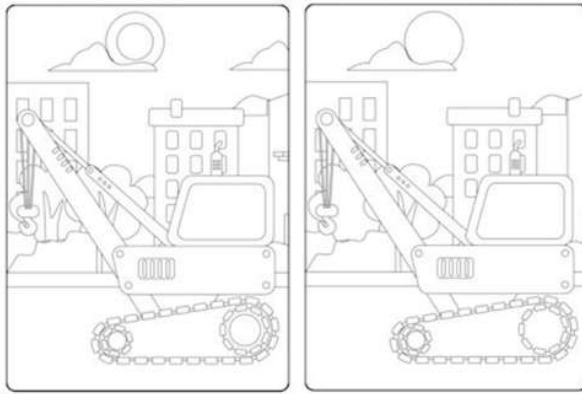

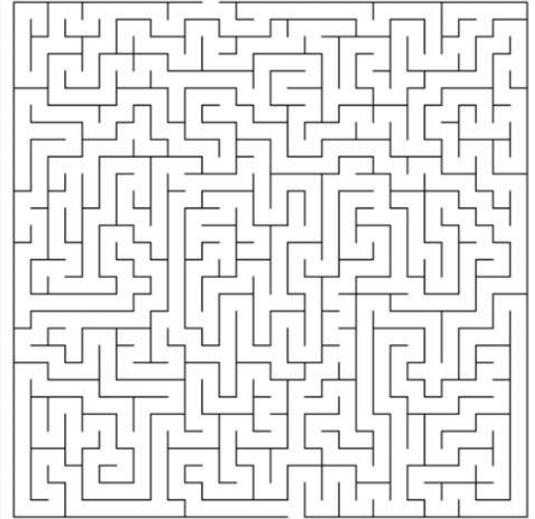


SPOT THE DIFFERENCE

Can you spot the 10 differences between these two pictures?

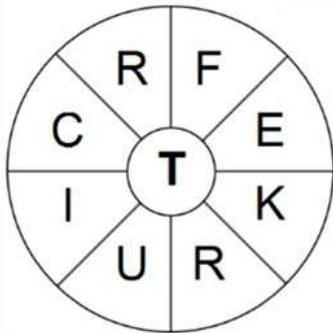


Toys maze

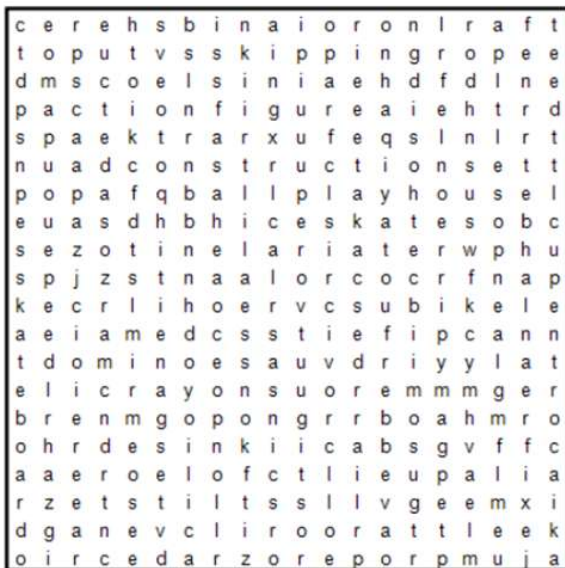
